R. K. Redding Construction Builds on Success by Winning Associated General Contractors (AGC) of America Awards

During the AGC award ceremony, RKR won the following:

- **First Place Award** – Georgia Tech Boggs Nuclear Radiation Engineering (NRE) Lab Renovation
- **Merit Award** – University of West Georgia (UWG) Campus Bookstore

Georgia Tech Boggs Nuclear Radiation Engineering Lab Renovation

RKR served as the general contractor for the \$4.2 million, 8,000 square foot Georgia Tech NRE lab project. This unique project required the renovation of space inside the building for use as a radiation control zone facility, including a complete rework of the space and building systems, as well as the installation of new lab equipment, all while the building was occupied with ongoing sensitive research projects in other areas of the building.

For the project, the original seven-month schedule was condensed into four months in order to meet the delivery date. The project was completed under budget, which allowed the client to use the savings for additional enhancements to lab spaces, which furthers their research capabilities. Additionally, there were no safety incidents or accidents of any kind on the project.

University of West Georgia Campus Bookstore

RKR served as the construction manager for the \$4.85 million, 23,000 square foot University of West Georgia Campus Bookstore project. Designed to LEED standards, the project was constructed on an extremely compact site at the busiest intersection on the campus. RKR brought this beautiful facility to fruition, on budget, ahead of schedule, with no lost time due to accidents and ready to open in advance to the Fall 2011 semester.

Other Announcements

During the AGC Conference, RKR Project Manager Casey Pollard was formally placed on the AGC Board of Directors. Pollard has worked at RKR for 14 years and has been on the AGC Young Leadership Program Board of Directors for the past 5 years.

RKR is also pleased to announce it has recently completed the Trinka Davis Veterans Village, which is dedicated to the medical and rehabilitation needs of former U.S. Armed Forces members. The Trinka Davis Veterans Village is a \$17MM gift from the Trinka Davis Foundation of Birmingham, AL, and will be staffed and operated by the Federal Veterans Administration (VA). Located in Carrollton, the 74,000 sq. ft. complex features a 48-bed assisted living capability, as well as 88 treatment and rehabilitation rooms. It has already been certified as a LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) Gold facility by the U.S. Green Building Council. The VA is expected to receive the keys to the complex and begin services this summer.
